

# ADDRESSING FORCED CONVERSION OF HINDU MINORITIES TO ISLAM IN PAKISTAN

More than 20% in 1947, in 2017 Hindus were estimated to be around 2%, of Pakistan's population, according to census data, with most of them living in Sindh Province.

ABC reports estimate that as many as 1,000 girls and young women may be forcibly converted each year, primarily from Pakistan's Hindu community. Most of these cases are centred on the Dargah Bharchundi Sharif seminary, where Mian Abdul Haq, also known as Mian Mithoo, runs a 'forced conversion factory', as described by Daud Khattak. Radio Mashaal shows that the seminary does bear the hallmarks of a "conversion factory," with girls and young women vanishing from their homes, marrying and converting virtually overnight, and kept away from their family -- often by court order and with the backing of Mithoo.

The groups most affected by this issue are pre-adolescent Hindu, Sikh, and Christian girls. Many of these girls are violently abducted from their homes, forced to accept Islam and thrown into abusive marriages with older men, and finally blackmailed into giving a statement of consent over video. Fake documentation such as birth certificates is produced to falsely show they are consenting adults to the marriage and conversion. They are not allowed to see their families again and very few escape and live to tell their stories.

Child marriage, forced conversion, abduction, and sexual violence violate an individual's human rights and eliminate any sense of control they may have over their own life and decisions. The effects of these horrific actions traumatize each victim, hindering their ability to foster positive relationships, pursue their goals, and live a fulfilling life. Hindus, Christians, Sikhs, Jains, and Buddhists living in Pakistan as minorities face lives of pure hell on a daily basis. INSIGHT UK is committed to spreading awareness of the atrocities and brutality that young girls in Pakistan face daily.

Based on conservative estimates by The Movement of Solidarity and Peace, 1,000 girls from religious minorities are forced to convert to Islam, largely paving the way for nonconsensual marriages of minors in Sindh, Pakistan. Human rights activists say the practice has accelerated during the coronavirus lockdowns when girls are out of school and more visible, bride traffickers are more active on the Internet, and families are finding themselves in greater debt.

In December 2020, the U.S. State Department declared Pakistan "a country of particular concern" for severe violations of religious freedoms. The declaration was based in part on an appraisal by the U.S. Commission on International Religious Freedom (USCIRF) that underage girls in the minority Hindu, Christian, and Sikh communities were "kidnapped for forced conversion to Islam... forcibly married and subjected to rape."

With combined efforts and enough noise, we can help save the innocent lives of thousands of young girls in Pakistan.



## THE FACTS FORCED CONVERSION IN PAKISTAN



Religious minorities suffer from rampant discrimination and remain disenfranchised in society. They are largely excluded from the political system in Pakistan and remain severely underrepresented in all spheres of mainstream life. "It's hundreds, hundreds, many girls, many girls. This crime is committed by many people, and the authorities don't do anything".

The U.S. State Department declared Pakistan "a country of particular concern" for violations of religious freedoms — a designation the Pakistani government rejects. The declaration was based in part on an appraisal by the U.S. Commission on International Religious Freedom that underage girls in the minority Hindu, Christian, and Sikh communities were "kidnapped for forced conversion to Islam... forcibly married and subjected to rape."

The conversion certificates for targeted girls are prepared in advance. Mistakes like the incorrect father's name are ignored,"

"Overall, religious minorities do not feel safe in Pakistan," "But poor Hindus are the most vulnerable among them. They are extremely poor and illiterate, and Muslim mosques, charities and traders exploit them easily and lure them to convert to Islam. A lot of money is involved in it.""

### RECOMMENDATIONS



- 1. Implement Conditions on funding allocated from the UK government to give in foreign aid to the state of Pakistan.
- 2. Commission an official report every six months documenting the socio-economic state of Hindu, Christian, Sikh, Jewish, and other minority communities in Pakistan.
- 3. Provide Safe Havens for minorities in Pakistan who have fallen victims to forced conversion, kidnapping, marriage, and religious persecution.
- 4. Allow victims of religious persecution in Pakistan to access expedited citizenship in Safe Haven countries such as the United Kingdom and India.
- 5. To provide victims and their families with governmentallocated support, **call on**
- the UK's Foreign Secretary
- Prime Minister's Special Envoy for Freedom of Religion or Belief
- Prime Minister's Special Representative on Preventing Sexual Violence in Conflict and Minister of State (Minister for South Asia and the Commonwealth)
